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Minor program is offered to students enrolled in Ilia State University undergraduate educational programs. Students can choose minor speciality before the start of the 2nd semester.

### **Program Aims**

The aim of the program is to equip the graduates with knowledge of the English language at B2 level, the theoretical foundations of the English language as well give them basic knowledge of British and/or American literature, history and culture.

## Learning Outcomes and Competencies

Upon completion of the minor program, the graduate:

- has at least B2 level English language competence;
- demonstrates knowledge of the main linguistic categories of the English language; •
- demonstrates knowledge of the principles of Anglo-American literature; •
- demonstrates knowledge of one of the periods in the history of English literature; •
- can describe the major principles of language structure and linguistic system using basic linguistic • terminology;
- can describe and analyze the famous works of several prominent authors of Anglo-American literature using • basic literary terminology;
- can comprehend the intercultural context.

### Instruction Methods

Depending on the specifics of the learning components, other teaching methods can be used during the implementation of the program, which is presented in the syllabi of certain courses.

#### Structure of the Program

A student of Anglistics program must take:

- 1. <u>Compulsory courses with the code</u> HUMENGEN 24 credits:
  - Introduction to Anglistics
  - Principles of Theory of English Language
  - Introduction to Anglo-American Literary Studies

- English Language Discourse Upper Intermediate 2
- 2. Compulsory or/and Compulsory-elective Courses with the code HUMENGEN or/and HUMEN **36** credits, among them at least one course (6 credits) from Literary Studies courses and practical language courses.

# Assessment System

100-point Assessment System defined as follows:

(A) Excellent – 91-100 points;

(B) Very good – 81-90 points;

(C) Good - 71-80 points;

(D) Satisfactory – 61-70 points;

(E) Sufficient – 51-60 points;

(FX) Didn't Pass – 41-50 points, which means that a student needs to work more and is allowed to resit the exam once by working independently;

(F) Failed -40 and less points of maximum evaluation, which means that the work done by the student is not enough and he/she has to retake the course.
