Assessment System

Assessment is based on a 100 point system. Points will be distributed and defined as follows:

(A) Excellent – 91-100 points;

(B) Very Good – 81-90 points;

(C) Good – 71- 80 points;

(D) Satisfactory – 61-70 points;

(E) Sufficient – 51-60 points.

(FX) Did not pass – 41-50 points, which means that the student needs to work more and is allowed to retake the exam once by working independently;

(F) Fail – 40 points and less of the maximum grade, which means that the work done by the student is not enough and he/she has to retake the course.
