Prerequisites (requirements)

Candidates must have passed the unified national exams in accordance with the rules established by the Ministry of Education and Science of Georgia. Also, the contestant must undergo an institutional creative round.

Within the framework of the internal university(institutional) creative round, the candidate's compositional thinking and the ability to convey an idea using various artistic materials based on the submitted portfolio are tested;

Program Aims

The goal of the program is to prepare a competitive specialist in the field of ceramics for the decoration of public spaces, able to contribute to the process of cultural-aesthetic development of modern society.

A specialist trained within the program will have/be:

- mastered the basic disciplines of fine and applied art and design and theoretical knowledge of traditional art fields and the latest trends;
- mastered the basic skills of composition, techniques, tools and materials related to artistic ceramics in order to be able to conceptualize an idea and implement it;
- ready to pursue a successful professional career and/or further education.

In addition, the program will enable students to develop transferable skills, such as critical thinking, finding/analyzing visual and theoretical material to develop original ideas and concepts, effective presentation/demonstration of one's creativity using modern technologies and adhering to the principles of academic integrity.

Learning Outcomes and Competencies

The graduate is/can:

- 1. demonstrates a broad knowledge of the basic principles, technologies, laws and practices of the mandatory core disciplines of fine and applied art and design, as well as the traditional fields of visual arts and the latest trends;
- 2. is equipped with basic skills of drawing and painting, technologies and principles of working with drawing and painting materials;
- 3. demonstrates knowledge of the capabilities of ceramic materials and related technological processes;
- 4. In accordance with the predetermined guidelines, the graduate can create an author's work in artistic ceramics based on the research and analysis of relevant visual and theoretical material, using appropriate technologies and techniques, materials and tools;
- 5. can reveal own style and creative vision in his/her work;

- 6. can avoid plagiarism in the process of developing and implementing creative ideas;
- 7. can effectively communicate his/her own creative ideas orally or in writing using modern communication technologies;
- 8. can work effectively individually or in groups; take care of developing his/her own knowledge and professional skills;
- 9. can manage his/her own learning process using a wide range of filed-specific learning resources.
