<b>Aims of the Program</b>	
<p>The aim of the program is to create an environment integrated with performance practice for future directors and actors and to give them the opportunity to work in one of the directions of theater art (directing or acting art) based on the principles of a workshop in an actual theater; based on the acquisition of new knowledge, to develop their own individual creative vision and to deepen the practical skills of co-authoring a performance in order to be ready for both independent professional advancement and creation of a competitive environment in the field of theater art.</p> <p>The program is based on the experience of programs of the world's leading theater schools, such as Yale Drama School (USA), Royal Holloway University, Royal Conservatory of Scotland (Great Britain) and other.</p>	
<b>Learning Outcomes and Competencies</b>	
Upon completion of the program The Art of Live Theatre: Staging and Performance, the graduate has/can:	

1. a deep and systematic knowledge of the ways of theater art development: theories and methods, forms and directions, classical and modern approaches, literary and practical analysis;
2. create a theatrical product in a professional environment, through the collaboration of the director and actors, for which he/she uses traditional and modern theater theories and methods and makes an innovative synthesis of ideas;
3. complex skills of critical thinking and analytical writing;
4. evaluates his/her own and others' creative skills and adequately uses the capabilities of the creative group;
5. communication skill; as a result of the work based on the principles of the workshop in the actual theater, he/she has a good relationship with the creative and staging team, colleagues, specialists in the field, audience, sponsors, mass media, theater administration, technical staff, etc.;
6. maintain professional ethics and academic integrity;

Upon obtaining a master's degree in acting, the graduate:

- 7.1. can comprehend the role, work independently on the role, create and publicly demonstrate using the elements of the acting skills;

Upon obtaining a master's degree in drama directing, the graduate:

- 7.2. can select a dramaturgical work and implement the creative concept of a theatrical performance of different styles and genres according to the literary source in different ways;
- 7.3. can create, process and manage a theatrical product at its initial, main and post-production stages.

### Instruction Methods

### Structure of the Program

In order to successfully complete the master's program The Art of Live Theatre: Staging and Performance, a student must accumulate 120 credits according to the scheme below:

- **General Block-Theatre Workshop:** 51 credits
- **Directing Block:** 27 credits
- **Acting Block:** 27 credits
- **General Elective Block:** 12 credits
- **Diploma Performance:** 30 credits

### Assessment System

Assessment System:

(A) Excellent – 91-100 points;

(B) Very good – 81-90 points;

(C) Good – 71-80 points;

(D) Satisfactory – 61-70 points;

(E) Sufficient – 51-60 points;

(FX) Didn't Pass – 41-50 points, which means that a student needs to work more and is allowed to retake the exam once by working independently;

(F) Failed – 40 and less points of maximum evaluation, which means that the work done by the student is not enough and he/she has to retake the course
