<p><b>The goals of the Bachelor of Law program are as follows:</b></p> <p><b>To prepare a competitive specialist in the field of law who will:</b></p> <p>a) have broad knowledge of the essence of law, basic principles, features of the national system, the specifics of the main issues of public, criminal, private and international law.</p> <p>b) will be able to identify legal problems, evaluate them and determine the legal actions necessary to solve the problem, in accordance with predetermined instructions;</p> <p>c) will be able to communicate with specialists and non-specialists in an appropriate oral and written form, observing the principles of academic integrity;</p> <p>c) will be able to act in compliance with the rules of professional conduct of lawyers and fundamental human rights.</p>	
<b>Learning outcomes and competencies (general and sectoral)</b>	
<p><b>After completing the Bachelor Law Program, the student:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Describes the essence of law, main principles, legal systems, basic legal methods, types of legal norms, historical sources of Georgian law.</li> <li>2. Defines conceptual and value issues of human rights. Explains the main essence of public, criminal and private law, national system, particularities of substantive and procedural legislation, describes the correlation between international and national law.</li> <li>3. Drafts legal acts (including drafts of civil and administrative agreements, legal acts, procedural documents, individual and normative administrative acts), develops dispute resolution strategies and tactics.</li> <li>4. Analyses sources of law, norms, identifies difficult problems in the field of private, public or criminal law and develops ways of solving them using legal methods.</li> <li>5. Discusses legal problems and their solutions with specialists and non-specialists orally and in writing.</li> <li>6. Searches for necessary information by processing sources of national and international law, judicial practice, scientific news and legislative changes, demonstrates the ability to continuously update knowledge.</li> <li>7.
